











You are about to embark on a very special journey past botanic gardens, sandy beaches, internationally important habitat and spectacular historic buildings.

The trail is easily navigated by foot or bicycle and is clearly signposted with tall markers topped with colourful nautical motifs sharing local information.

The total length of the trail from the Westgate Bridge to Skeleton Creek is 23km.


